JORDAN VINEYARDS AND ESTATE

Maggie Kruse - winemaker



After graduating from UC-Davis in 2005 with a bachelor's degree in viticulture and enology, Maggie worked for J Vineyards & Winery in the Russian River Valley, before transitioning to the laboratory at Jordan. She worked closely with long-time Winemaker Rob Davis on wine quality improvement programs initiated by John Jordan, fine-tuning barrel sourcing, cork selections and the bottling process while Davis focused on locating even better vineyards for grapes. After being promoted to assistant winemaker in 2009, she began overseeing all aspects of barrel ordering, cork quality control and bottling, as well as managing the cellar work.

As winemaker at Jordan, Maggie oversees all aspects of managing the day-to-day operations in the cellars, including quality control experiments, fermentation monitoring, tank and lot organizing, selecting and inspecting barrels, blending, batonnage, selecting corks and bottles, bottling and labeling. She works closely with Dana Grande and Brent Young on guiding the grapes from the vineyard to the winery. Maggie's dedication to quality has taken her to Portugal several times to learn about cork-making and to the forests of France to study barrel-crafting.

Niki Williams - Winemaker



Winemaker Niki Williams brings more than a decade of experience from some of Napa Valley's most well-known wine estates including: Mount Veeder Winery, The Prisoner Wine Company, Franciscan Estate, Merryvale Family of Wines, and Chateau St. Jean. During these tenures, Williams gained extensive winemaking experience with a wide range of red and white varieties and explored the latest cellar and vineyard technologies to elevate fruit and wine to their highest quality. Her philosophy and practice of crafting balanced, elegant blends that are approachable when young, yet capable of aging gracefully make her a perfect complement to and continuation of Cakebread Cellar's 50-year standard and history of winemaking.

Kristen Barnhisel - Winemaker



Kristen was raised in Santa Rosa by a microbiologist mother, who worked for Simi Winery, and a father who was a home winemaker. Though she grew up immersed in the wine industry, even working harvests as a summer job, it wasn't until she traveled to Italy while earning her B.A. in Italian literature that she was inspired to become a winemaker. Encouraged by legendary California winemaker and family friend Zelma Long, Kristen became one of the first women, and the first American, to work harvest for Ruffino in Italy. Kristen went on to earn a master's degree in enology from UC Davis, while also working a number of coveted internships, including Warwick Wine Estate in South Africa, Opus One, and Long Vineyard, where she gained invaluable knowledge working alongside her mentor, Zelma Long.

Today, utilizing her extensive experience with cool-climate white wine varieties, Kristen works alongside President/COO Jeff Meier and Director of Winemaking Steve Peck to guide J. Lohr's white wine program.

Katie Madigan- Winemaker



As a St. Francis Winemaker, Katie continues St. Francis' long tradition of creating high-quality wines from Sonoma County grapes. She oversees production of St. Francis Winery's top-selling Zinfandels, Pinot Noirs and Chardonnays as well as many of our other popular white wines. In 2015, Katie was awarded "Best Woman Winemaker" by the International Women's Wine Competition. She also won Zinfandel Producer of the Year in 2014 and 2015 at the California Zinfandel Championship.

Katie's relentless pursuit to make wines that reflect the beauty and uniqueness in each vintage is what got her to where she is today. Her vision has always been to "produce self-expressing, balanced wines from a region known most for its diverse terroir."

Growing up on the north coast of Oregon, Kate's younger years were spent fishing, crabbing, and gathering mushrooms. Her interest in science and love of animals led her to the University of California, Davis where she majored in viticulture and enology. In 2011, Kate took on the role of Associate Winemaker at Hess Collection Winery, where she remained until 2016 when the Pinot Noir of the Pacific Northwest called her back north. At Penner-Ash Wine Cellars Kate quickly rose to her current role of Winemaker in the spring of 2018.

Nicole returned to the hands-on side of wine in 2004 when she traveled to Western Australia for a harvest internship. Back in the U.S., Nicole took a role as a winemaker, crafting wines grown throughout Northern California. In 2015, Nicole also earned an MBA from the Wine Business Institute at Sonoma State University, gaining an academic perspective on the business of the wine industry as well as how it will evolve in the future.

Today, Nicole is the head winemaker at J Vineyards & Winery, where she oversees all aspects of winemaking. Nicole's passion for winemaking continues to grow as she crafts world-class sparkling and varietal wines from cool-climate fruit grown in the renowned Russian River Valley and Sonoma County.
